On the first Sunday after Labor Day we celebrate **National Grandparent's Day**. This year the date falls on **September 11**. Like Mother's Day and Father's Day, we also have a whole day dedicated to our grandparents. Grandparents and children have a special connection that is proven to both make grandparents live longer, and also make children more emotionally resilient. Grandparent's Day is an opportunity to treasure that connection and spend some quality family time together.



Every year from **September 15 to October 15**, Americans celebrate **National Hispanic Heritage Month** by appreciating the community's history, heritage, and contributions of the ancestors of American citizens who came from Mexico, Spain, the Caribbean, and South and Central America. Hispanic Heritage Month originally started with one week of commemoration when it was first introduced by Congressman George E. Brown in June 1968. With the civil rights movement, the need to recognize the contributions of the Latin community gained traction in the 1960s. Awareness of the multicultural groups living in the United States was also gradually growing.

Two heavily Latinx and Hispanic populated areas, the San Gabriel Valley and East Los Angeles, were represented by Brown. His aim was to recognize the integral roles of these communities in American history. Observation of Hispanic Heritage Week started in 1968 under President Lyndon B. Johnson and was later extended to a 30-day celebration by President Ronald Reagan, starting on September 15 and ending on October 15. It was enacted into law via approval of Public Law 100-402 on August 17, 1988.

September 15 is set as the starting date for the month as it is important for many reasons. It is the independence anniversary for Latin American countries El Salvador, Guatemala, Costa Rica, Nicaragua, and Honduras. From here onwards, the independence days of Mexico and Chile fall on September 16 and September 18, respectively. Dia de la Raza or Columbus Day also falls within the month of October (October 12).

Hispanic Americans have been integral to the prosperity of the U.S. Their contributions to the nation are immeasurable, and they embody the best of American values. The Hispanic-American community has left an indelible mark on the U.S. culture and economy. It is a time to appreciate and celebrate the colorful cultures, rich histories, and diversity of the American Latino community.

June 1 - November 30

## Be Prepared and ...

**Know Your Hurricane Risk** - Hurricanes are not just a coastal problem. Find out how rain, wind, water and even tornadoes could happen far inland from where a hurricane or tropical storm makes landfall. <u>Start preparing now</u>.

Make an Emergency Plan - Make sure everyone in your household knows and understands your hurricane plans. Include the office, kids' day care, and anywhere else you frequent in your hurricane plans. Ensure your business has a continuity plan to continue operating when disaster strikes.

**Know your Evacuation Zone -** You may have to evacuate quickly due to a hurricane if you live in an evacuation zone. <u>Learn your evacuation routes</u>, practice with your household and pets, and identify where you will stay.

Follow the instructions from local emergency managers, who work closely with state, local, tribal, and territorial agencies, and partners. They will provide the latest recommendations based on the threat to your community and appropriate safety measures.

**Recognize Warnings and Alerts -** Have several ways to receive alerts. <u>Download the FEMA app</u> and receive real-time alerts from the National Weather Service for up to five locations nationwide. <u>Sign up for community alerts</u> in your area and be aware of the Emergency Alert System (EAS) and Wireless Emergency Alert (WEA), which require no sign up.

**Those with Disabilities** - Identify if you may need additional help during an emergency if you or anyone else in your household is an <u>individual with a disability</u>.

**Review Important Documents -** Make sure your <u>insurance policies and personal documents</u>, such as ID, are up to date. Make copies and keep them in a secure password-protected digital space.

**Strengthen your Home -** De-clutter drains and gutters, bring in outside furniture, and consider hurricane shutters.

**Get Tech Ready -** <u>Keep your cell phone charged</u> when you know a hurricane is in the forecast and purchase backup charging devices to power electronics.

Help your Neighborhood - Check with neighbors, <u>senior</u> adults, or those who may need additional help securing hurricane plans to see how you can be of assistance to others **Gather Supplies** - <u>Have enough supplies</u> for your household, include medication, disinfectant supplies and <u>pet supplies</u> in your go bag or car trunk. You may not have access to these supplies for days or even weeks after a hurricane.

"Clinics Can Help" cleans and refurbishes the equipment it receives, and redistributes it, along with donated medical supplies, to Palm Beach County residents who need it. "Clinics Can Help" stores the equipment and supplies at its warehouse at 2560 Westgate Avenue in West Palm Beach. Last year it provided over 3,000 children and adults in Palm Beach County with medical equipment and supplies.
