# **DID YOU KNOW?...**

**AUGUST** is the eighth month of the year in the <u>Julian</u> and <u>Gregorian calendars</u>. Its length is 31 days.

In the <u>Southern Hemisphere</u>, August is the seasonal equivalent of <u>February</u> in the <u>Northern Hemisphere</u>. In the Northern Hemisphere, August falls in summer. In the Southern Hemisphere, the month falls during winter. In many European countries, August is the holiday month for most workers. Numerous religious holidays occurred during August in ancient Rome.

Certain <u>meteor showers</u>take place in August. The <u>Kappa Cygnids</u> occur in August, with yearly dates varying. The <u>Alpha Capricornids</u> meteor shower occurs as early as July 10 and ends around August 10. The Southern Delta Aquariids occur from mid-July to mid-August, with the peak usually around July 28-29. The <u>Perseids</u>, a major meteor shower, typically takes place between July 17 and August 24, with the peak days varying yearly. The star cluster of <u>Messier 30</u> is best observed around August.

Among the aborigines of the Canary Islands, especially among the <u>Guanches</u> of <u>Tenerife</u>, the month of August received the name of Beñesmer or <u>Beñesmen</u>, which was also the harvest festival held that month.

The month was originally named <u>Sextilis</u> in <u>Latin</u> because it was the 6th month in the original ten-month <u>Roman calendar</u> under <u>Romulus</u> in 753 BC, with <u>March</u> being the first month of the year. About 700 BC, it became the eighth month when <u>January</u> and <u>February</u> were added to the year before March by King <u>Numa Pompilius</u>, who also gave it 29 days. <u>Julius Caesar</u> added two days when he created the <u>Julian calendar</u> in 46 <u>BC (AUC</u> 708), giving it its modern length of 31 days.

In 8 BC, the month was renamed in honor of Emperor <u>Augustus</u>. According to a <u>Senatus consultum</u> quoted by <u>Macrobius</u>, he chose this month because it was the time of several of his great triumphs, including the conquest of Egypt. Commonly repeated lore has it that August has 31 days because Augustus wanted his month to match the length of Julius Caesar's July, but this is an invention of the 13th century scholar <u>Johannes de Sacrobosco</u>. Sextilis had 31 days before it was renamed. It was not chosen for its length.

August's birthstones are the peridot, sardonux, and spinel. Its birth flower is the gladiolus or poppy, meaning beauty, strength of character, love, marriage and family. The Western zodiac signs are Leo (until August 22) and Virgo (from August 23).

# LABOR DAY ~ September 1st



Labor Day is a United States federal holiday, honoring working people, their contributions, achievements and sacrifices in pursuit of national prosperity and well-being. It is held annually on the first Monday of September.

Labor Day is celebrated with street parades, sports events and picnics held all over the country. The Labor Day weekend is generally seen to mark the end of the <u>summer</u> season (while the <u>Memorial Day</u> weekend is considered to be the beginning). Summer cultural activities end, and <u>fall</u> activities, such as school and sports events, start around this time. In many areas school classes resume shortly before or after Labor Day.

Labor Day has evolved into a significant shopping weekend for discounts and sales, especially for back-to-school sales, as many retailers try to capitalize on the large number of prospective customers with time to spend. It has become one of the busiest sales days of the year.

While Canada shares the date of its <u>Labour Day</u> with Labor Day in the US, in many other countries <u>Labour Day</u> is typically held on May 1.

# Why is US Labor Day celebrated in September when most other nations commemorate it on May 1?

The first Labor Day celebration in the US took place on September 5, 1882, in New York, with a street parade followed by a picnic. In the years that followed, the holiday was recognized as an official public holiday by a number of states, until Congress declared it a federal holiday in 1894.

The first Monday in September was chosen as the holiday's anniversary because it was regarded more politically neutral and less inflammatory than the date commemorating the bloody Haymarket riots on May 1 - 4, 1886. The date was also well located on the calendar, sitting midway between the Fourth of July and Thanksgiving Day public holidays.
