STUDENT ASSISTANCE FUND AWARD PROGRAM



Each year we offer deserving local high school graduates the opportunity to apply for a monetary "Student Assistance Award" from our organization.

Past student awards ranged from \$500 - \$1,500 per student.

AWARD CEREMONY

Each year in the month of May or June, CAFCI holds an award ceremony for students, their families, and members and friends of CAFCI.

STUDENT ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Students applying must have at least a cumulative 2.7 GPA and demonstrate continuous academic success in their high school tenure to be eligible.
- Applicants must show that they have participated in school and community activities.
- Applicants must show interest in the Caribbean community.
- The monetary assistance is awarded to students who are going on to a college, university, or other accredited institution of higher learning.
- If selected, the student must provide proof of acceptance from the school before receiving the award.







Immigration agents or ICE may come to your workplace, school, or even place of worship. You have rights, regardless of where you are at!

UNDERSTAND WHAT ICE CAN AND CANNOT DO!

Anyone can enter public spaces, including ICE agents. However, to enter PRIVATE spaces, agents must receive an authorization or have a valid JUDICIAL warrant.

For example, ICE can enter the main dining room of a restaurant, but CANNOT search an area that is closed to the public, such as the kitchen, a storage room, or a private office without a Judicial Warrant giving them the power to do so.

1. If ICE comes to your work, school or place of worship:

- **Stay calm and do not run.** Running may be viewed as an admission that you have something to hide.
- **Do NOT answer any question** or ONLY ask to “speak to a lawyer”.
- **Say aloud “I do not consent to a search”** and encourage others to do the same. If ICE agents try to search property, bags, or the pockets of someone at the work site, this could be challenged later in court.
- Ask if you are free to leave - if the agents say no, say: **“I want to remain silent and want to speak with my lawyer.”**

2. Prepare your coworkers and peers - remind everyone to:

- **Stay calm and to NOT answer any questions**
- **NOT help ICE agents sort people** by their immigration status or the country they are from.
- Watch the agents and see if they are complying with what’s written in the Judicial Warrant if they have one.
- **NOT hand over any IDs or papers to ICE.** All workers have this right.

INFORM COWORKERS AND PEERS!

Talk with your coworkers, inform them of their rights!

Share <http://flic.fyi/kyr> with them so they can print their own “Know Your Rights” cards.

3. If possible, prepare your workplace, school, and place of worship:

- **Identify an assigned spokesperson to be in charge of talking with agents.** This person must ask to see a Judicial Warrant and is responsible for reviewing its scope and validity.
- ICE can only gain access to private areas that are listed in the Judicial Warrant.
- **Have FLIC’s Hotline number -1-888-600-5762 in a place where everyone can see it.** Call the Hotline as soon as possible to report the raid.
- If ICE arrests any of your peers, ask agents where they are being taken to. This information will help the person’s family and lawyer find them.
- Train everyone to NOT interact with ICE agents. If ICE agents have questions or requests, your workers and peers should say nothing, or say: “You are not allowed to enter. Talk to _____ (name of the assigned spokesperson)”

WARNING:

ICE agents may try to stop, question, or even arrest a worker without the proper authority. **The best way for workers to protect their rights is to stay silent and ask for an attorney.**

By informing yourself and the people around you, you are helping to protect everyone. **Letting your coworkers, employer, and peers know about these rights will make a big difference**
