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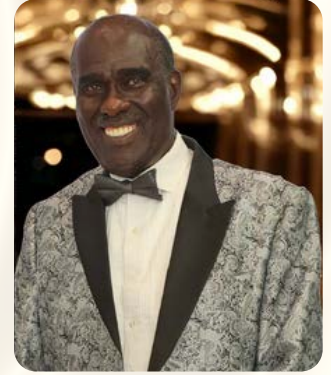
Goals & Purposes

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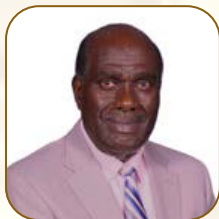

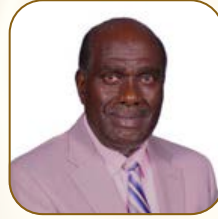

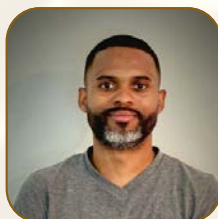

Fourteen years after inception in 1989, CAFCI spread its wings and created its first subsidiary relationship in 2003 as the charter organization for Boy Scouts of America Troop 111, Royal Palm Beach. In 2004 the Ferrin Memorial Scholarship Fund was established to encourage and assist the youths in the community to reach their goals. Later in 2006, CAFCI became the charter organization for Cub Scout Pack 111 (formerly Pack 120), Royal Palm Beach. In 2024 Troop 4111 for girls was established. All subsidiaries believe in and adopt CAFCI's Mission, support CAFCI's Vision, as well as CAFCI's Goals and Purposes, also contributing to educational and humanitarian efforts as needed.

Outstanding Citizen of the Year

WINSOM GENUS MARTIN



Winsom Genus Martin was born in Grove Town, South Manchester, Jamaica, where she lived and started her formal education. She attended Mico Teachers College for three years graduating in 1976. It wasn't long before she was offered a teaching position at Harwood School in St Catherine. After Harwood School, Winsom taught at Old Harbour Primary School and Mandeville Primary School. Winsom was known as an Activist in her community, a real go-getter that got things done. Although she was very young, because of her kind considerate ways, and concern with the welfare of others, she was not afraid to speak out to politicians regarding rural electrification and water for her community, and she got it done.

Winsom migrated to Boynton Beach, Florida with her former husband Norman in 1982, however, every year she traveled back to Jamaica, with a barrel, to visit her mom. That barrel was full of not only supplies but it was also filled with her passion for helping others, especially the youth. Every year Winsom brought and distributed school supplies for the children in her district.

Ten years later, they made the decision to move to Royal Palm Beach where they raised their family, a plus not only for the community, but for CAFCI as well.

Winsom worked as an Accounts Payable Analyst at the Boca Raton Resort and later spent over 20 years as the Human Resource Manager at the Boca West Country Club. From there, she worked with the Palm Beach County School system before retiring in 2018.

In the early 1990s, Winsom joined CAFCI, where she immediately began volunteering her time. She has served on CAFCI's community outreach and cultural awareness committees which includes Toys for Tots Drive, the Annual Talent Show, the Student Assistance Fund program and the Cultural Committee which coordinates the annual Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day and Cultural Diversity Day celebrations and CAFCI's Relay for Life team. She also served on CAFCI's Board of Directors as Corresponding Secretary in 1996-1997 and returned to serve again in 2021. Whenever she is called on to assist she always answers "yes," and willingly jumps in to help even when not asked, serving at picnics and functions, always giving of herself.

Winsom is a dedicated and faithful member of St. Christopher's Episcopal Church, where she serves with quiet grace. As a member of the Alter Guild, she plays a vital role in preparing the church for worship by ensuring that the sanctuary is properly set for each service, lovingly decorating it with seasonal flowers and tending to its reverent upkeep before and after service.

In addition to her service on the Altar Guild, Winsom is an active member of the Episcopal Church Woman (ECW), a ministry by and for women throughout the Episcopal Church. At St. Christopher's, through the ECW, Winsom serves in many of their activities including hosting weekly coffee hours, organizing spring and fall rummage sales, and leading fundraising efforts. She also serves as an usher and greeter during Sunday services, and she spearheaded their monthly food pantry delivery program. Through her ministries, Winsom exemplifies a life of faithful service to others, not only to her Church Community but her community at large

Consistent with CAFCI's belief in improving the quality of life in our community and bringing about mutual understanding among the diverse ethnic groups through cultural awareness, we truly appreciate Winsom's extraordinary efforts in the community and in CAFCI.

CAFCI is honored and proud to have her as a member for over 30 years. It is with tremendous gratitude that CAFCI bestows the organization's 2025 Outstanding Citizen of the Year to Winsom Genus Martin, an honor she is most deserving of.

A Special Tribute to Honor

TWO CAFCI GIANTS WHO HAVE PASSED ON

Since the printing of the 2024 CAFCI Annual Friendship Ball Journal, two members who have served on the CAFCI Board and been integral to the success and growth of CAFCI have transitioned: Lawrence Logan and Fred Pinto. Both Lawrence and Fred were long-time CAFCI members, past CAFCI Presidents and major contributors to the advancement of the organization.



LAWRENCE LOGAN and his wife, Gwendolyn (Gwen), visited friends in Royal Palm Beach in the early 1990s and fell in love with the Village of Royal Palm Beach. The Logans were so captivated by the Village and the community, when they returned to New York, they put their home on the market and contracted the building of a home in Royal Palm Beach.

Upon their relocation they quickly established roots in the community where Lawrence became very involved. They found their spiritual home at St. David Episcopal Church where he was immediately very active and supportive. He joined CAFCI and Crestwood Performing Arts League (C-PAL) - a now defunct local cultural organization - and soon joined the board of both organizations.

Lawrence was a member of CAFCI for over 30 years and led and/or served on several committees: CAFCI President, CAFCI Board Chair, Friendship Ball Committee Chair, Membership Committee Chair, Newsletter Committee, Headquarter Administrator, Picnic Committee, New Year's Eve Gala Committee and the Interfaith Service Celebration Committee. Lawrence was a strong supporter of the CAFCI Youth; he never missed a Scout event. Most CAFCI functions were performed under the watchful eye of Lawrence who did not hesitate to share his thoughts.

Beyond CAFCI, he spent endless hours volunteering with the Royal Palm Beach County Young At Heart Program and the Meals and Senior Activity Center.

Until failing health curbed his activities, Lawrence could be considered CAFCI's ambassador. If you were new to the community, after Lawrence got to know you and was satisfied that you would be an asset to the organization, he would invite you, well, encourage you to come to a CAFCI meeting; there he would give you an application for membership and remind you to submit it until you complied. Each year, members who had not renewed their membership would receive reminders; those who needed more reminding would receive phone calls from Lawrence, sometimes he would make a house visit to collect the check.

Lawrence retained his passion for the welfare of CAFCI, St. David and the Royal Palm Beach community even after his declining health prevented him from physically participating in activities. CAFCI, St. David and the Village of Royal Palm Beach lost a great friend and ambassador in his passing on June 19, 2025.

MAYOR FREDERICK G. PINTO, a native New Yorker, grew up in the uptown Manhattan community of Harlem. As a young adult, Fred proudly served his country in the United States Army. He later enjoyed a successful career in the U.S financial center, Wall Street, New York.

In the late 1990s, Fred and his wife Brenda relocated and moved to Royal Palm Beach which he lovingly referred to as, "Mayberry". As a Veteran, he was no stranger to service so he quickly became immersed in community government and CAFCI. He won a seat on the Village Council in 2003 where he served for many years before becoming Mayor in 2016. He led the Village of Royal Palm Beach in that position until his unexpected passing on September 14, 2024. He worked tirelessly with the Council to improve and preserve the quality of life that we all enjoy in our unique village. Fred Pinto was the first African American to hold the office of Mayor in Royal Palm Beach.

Aside from government, Fred also chaired and was active in numerous other organizations. As a Lifetime CAFCI Member, he worked closely with former councilman and Vice Mayor of Royal Palm Beach, Vivian Ferrin. Together, they revised the CAFCI bylaws that still guide our organization today. In 2002 he was elected to the CAFCI Board of Directors and later served as Board President for three years. Under his leadership CAFCI flourished and become a vital part of the Royal Palm Beach community. Some of his accolades as CAFCI President include the launching of the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Celebration, the creation of the Grant Committee, the awarding of a Grant from the Palm Beach County Cultural Council, and the expansion of CAFCI's Youth Program to become the Charter Organization for Boy Scout Troop 111. Fred was a passionate believer in volunteerism who led CAFCI in support of Community Health, PBC literacy programs and the American Cancer Society's Relay for Life.

After stepping down as President, Fred continued to serve on the CAFCI Board until 2010. He was also a founding member of CAFCI's subsidiary organization, The Vivian and Adrienne Ferrin Memorial Scholarship Fund.

Fred Pinto remained a supporting member of all of the above-mentioned organizations and programs until his passing. His leadership in both government and CAFCI was unwavering. He led the way, illuminated the path and reached out to encourage others to make a difference in the lives of their community members. Council & board members, residents, veterans, first responders, CAFCI members, Scouts and family will forever remember Fred and cherish the legacy of a life well lived, not for self but for the betterment of others.

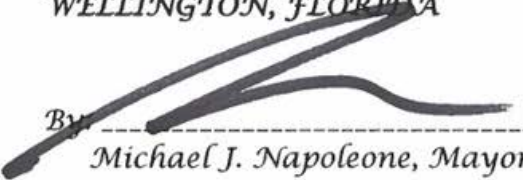

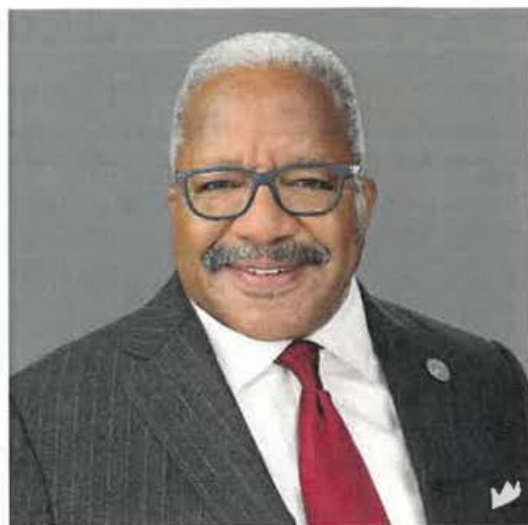

In August 2024 we were presented with an opportunity to purchase a condo unit but unfortunately, we were unable to close the deal due to the lack of ready funds or letter of commitment for a mortgage. This incident magnified the need for our organization to be able to show a more significant steady stream of income which is needed to obtain a commitment letter.

Consequently the Finance committee sought and received approval from the Board to pursue the set-up and operation of a business to address this issue.

Barclay Varlack spearheaded and assisted us in identifying business opportunities and gathering the information for a business plan and setting up a for-profit corporation.

Due to health reasons, Barclay has been unable to continue providing us with his assistance at the level needed to drive the effort forward. We remain in need of someone with the necessary knowledge, experience and skill to assist us in doing so.

By having a steady stream of income, the goal is to have a non-profit community funding organization provide us with a Letter of Interest or Credit so that when an opportunity arises, we have a funding source to supplement our available funds.

Other options under consideration include the purchase of a larger commercial building and subletting the remainder. To that end, we are also looking for someone with experience of managing properties to assist us in determining the feasibility of this option.

Participation in the Home Of Our Own project is available through the Buy-A-Brick program. We have made it easier to participate in the program by facilitating monthly payments to purchase a brick. Monthly payments of \$50 for a \$1,000 brick and \$150 for a \$3,000 brick are available.

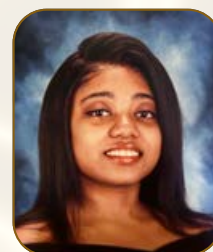

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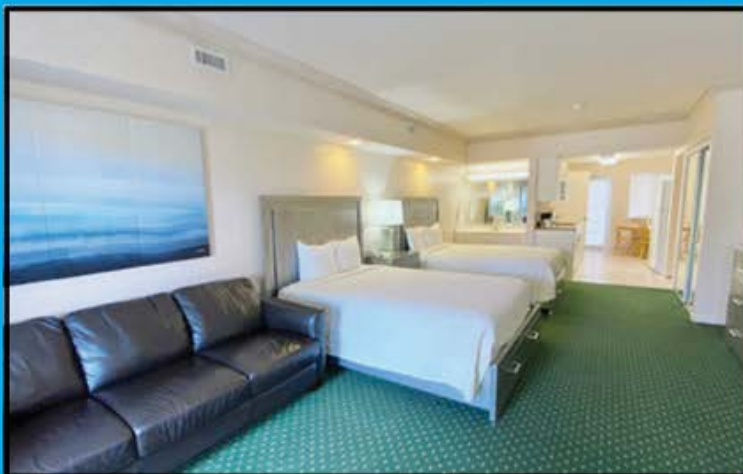

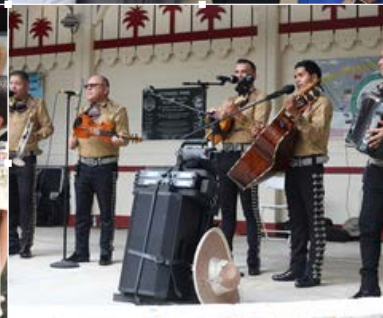
