PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

June was celebrated in the United States as Caribbean American heritage month. CAFCI, along with the rest of the nation, salute and recognize the significant contributions made by Caribbean Americans in economics, government, health, education and other walks of life. This celebration ties directly to our mission statement which states in part "To seek out, recognize and support persons of Caribbean ancestry residing in the United States."

Here are some interesting statistics from the United States Census Bureau – 2010:

2.7 million - The estimated U.S. population of West Indian ancestry. Some of the largest West Indian ancestry groups in the United States include:

- Jamaican (1.0 million)
- Haitian (908.000)
- Trinidadian and Tobagonian (196,000)
- Barbadian (62,000)
- Bahamian (53,000)
- U.S. Virgin Islander (17,000)

In addition, there are Hispanic or Latino origin groups in the United States who can trace their heritage to this part of the world:

- Puerto Rican (4.9 million)
- Cuban (1.9 million)
- Dominican (1.6 million)

Below is a quote from Congresswoman Barbara Lee, one of the chief sponsors of Caribbean heritage month.

"Americans of Caribbean ancestry reside in every part of the country. Millions have emigrated from the Caribbean to the United States. Throughout our history, Caribbean-Americans have served our country and contributed to the heritage of the United States through the arts, science, education, business, sports, military and government. The annual resolution allows Congress to continue recognizing the important contributions of Caribbean-Americans to our nation's history."
