Later in 2006, CAFCI became the charter organization for Cub Scout Pack 120, Royal Palm Beach. All three subsidiaries believe in and adopt CAFCI's Mission, support CAFCI's Vision, as well as CAFCI's Goals and Purposes, also contributing to educational and humanitarian efforts as needed.

The CAFCI 2023 Citizen of the Year, Yvonne Wright, embodies a life journey marked by unwavering commitment, compassion, and resilience. Originally hailing from Clarendon Parish, Jamaica, Yvonne moved as a young child to Kingston where she graduated from Trench Town High School. Her educational pursuits laid the groundwork for a future defined by service and dedication.

After graduation, Yvonne worked for the Jamaica Telephone Company as an operator, which is how she met her husband, Dennis. Shortly after moving to the United States and settling in Brooklyn, NY, the couple's shared aspirations led them to Connecticut, where Yvonne's care and compassion

for others drew her to pursuing additional education to become a nurse. With a career spanning several decades, Yvonne's nursing skills led her to Danbury Hospital and later, Hancock Hall Nursing Home. There she was known for her painless injections and often the only person who could get residents to take their medications. She saw the residents not only as patients but regarded them and their families as friends. Seeking a schedule that aligned with raising children, Yvonne joined a Urology practice as her final position in Connecticut.

After their three children, Annita, Brian, and Melissa, had grown up and left home, and missing the warmth of her homeland Jamaica, Yvonne and Dennis relocated to Florida; there she discovered a sense of belonging and community through their association with CAFCI. Yvonne continued working as a nurse, finding herself drawn to a nursing home once again, and to medical chart review as direct patient care became too taxing.

Since joining CAFCI, Yvonne has continued to personify the organization's core values of service and unity. A steadfast member of the Relay for Life Committee amongst others, she is known for helping wherever she feels needed. She shares her culinary talents by contributing food to all CAFCI events, including her mango bread for a meeting, a pot of rice and peas for the picnic, or her famous coconut drops to sell to raise additional funds for Relay for Life.

In addition to her work with CAFCI, she is an active member at St. David's in the Pines Episcopal Church where she has helped organize many fundraisers to benefit the church and serves on the ministry which creates floral arrangements for the altar. During the pandemic, when the Feeding South Florida food program was offered in Commons Park in Royal Palm Beach, Yvonne helped distribute the bags of grocery.

Despite her busy schedule, Yvonne still finds time to spend time where she is truly at peace, in her garden. Since relocating to Florida, she has been able to focus more on growing the fruits and vegetables she grew up eating on the island and is always happy to share when the crop is plentiful.

Yvonne is a much-appreciated member of the community; and CAFCI is pleased to name her our 2023 Outstanding Citizen of the Year.







At the General Membership meeting on April 9, 2022, it was reiterated that the Home of Our Own program funding was combined with the previous capital assets funding and that the biggest challenges facing us were the cost of property that included structures and our ability to obtain financing. The agreed strategy moving forward was to:

- Acquire property that we can afford (even if it is land without a structure).
- Reduce the desired minimum acreage from 5 to 2.
- View the purchase as an investment if it is not totally what we were looking for.
- Put a trailer on a land only purchase for use as our office.



Following that meeting, we had 4 leads but no real opportunities. In March 2023 we decided to include commercial condominiums as a viable starter option. Consequently, four condominium leads in the Royal Palm Beach area were identified. Three were outside of our price range. The owner of the fourth was willing to entertain an offer from us but we were unable to follow through against another offer alredy made on the property. Unfortunately, our Letter-of-

Interest from a prior opportunity was no longer valid resulting in our inability to follow through with an offer.

As we continue our search, the Finance Committee is looking at funding options for the procurement and maintenance of property. These options include operating a business and working with a non-profit community funding organization to provide us a with Letter-of-Interest or credit so that when another opportunity comes our way, we have a funding source to supplement our available funds.

Special thanks to Marjoroe Mendez, Lauriston Simms, Genieve White, Rhonda Ferrin-Davis, Winston Davis and Dennis Wright who took time to visit locations and look at properties. Thanks to Barclay Varlack for identifying business opportunities and getting information for a business plan.

Participation in the Home of Our Own project is available through the Buy-A-Brick program. Visit the web page at www.cafcipbc.org and click on the "Home of Our Own" tab or call Radcliffe "Woody" Brown at 561-791-3344 for more information. We have made it easier to participate in the program by facilitating monthly payments to purchase a brick. Monthly payments of \$50 for a \$1,000 brick and \$150 for a \$3,000 brick are available.

Please note that funds designated for the Home of Our Own project cannot be used to supplement lease payments or used for any other purposes than acquiring property that will serve as CAFCI's "Home". These funds are held in bank accounts/instruments that are separate from operating accounts.
