CAFCI HAS DONE IT AGAIN

On Saturday May 14, the Caribbean American For Community Involvement (CAFCI) held its annual **Student Assistance Award Ceremony** and **The Vivian Ferrin Memorial Scholarship Presentation** at the Kevin Harvin Center in Royal Palm Beach.

Many turned out to celebrate with and to honor the recipients of the 2011 awards. Seven well-deserving high school seniors were given \$1,000 and \$500.00 awards. The award ceremony was the focus of CAFCl's monthly meeting and was conducted by Board Liaison and Student Assistance Committee Chairperson, Dr.Elaine Ealy and Committee member and First Vice President of CAFCI, Attorney Nadine White-Boyd. The Student Assistance Committee and Awards Selection Committee include Atty. Nadine White-Boyd, Mr. Eution MacLarty, Mr. Alpha McDonald and Dr. Elaine Ealy.

The Vivian Ferrin Eagle Scout Scholarship of \$1,000.00 was awarded to a very deserving Eagle Scout from Troop 111, Alexander James "AJ" Fandrey. "AJ" is a senior at Seminole Ridge High School who will be attending University of Central Florida to pursue a degree in Forensic Science. CAFCI is the Charter Organization of the Boys Scout Association Troop 111 and Crew 2111. The Vivian Ferrin Memorial Scholarship is in memory of the Hon. Vivian Ferrin, late past Councilman of the Royal Palm Beach City Council and past president of CAFCI.

The Simms Award for Academic Excellence of \$500.00 was awarded to Legrans-Cia Jordonne, a senior from Boynton Beach Community High School who will be attending Florida Atlantic University to study Architecture. The Simms Award was made possible by the generosity of lifetime members of CAFCI, Mr. and Mrs. Lauriston Simms.

Awards of \$1,000.00 were also presented to each of the following students: Chloe Babb from William T. Dwyer High who plans to study Criminal Justice at Florida International University; Cassandra Knaggs from Boca Raton Community High School and she plans to major in Political Science and Pre-Law; Vasthi Ciceron from Jupiter High School plans to attend University of Florida where she will pursue a degree in Health Science and Nadia Numa from Boynton Beach High School who plans to study Aerospace Engineering at Embry Riddle Aeronautic University.

Presentations of award checks and certificates were made by the Mayor of Royal Palm Beach, Matty Mattioli, Mr. Lauriston Simms, CAFCI member and donor and Mrs. Babbette Bodden, a founding member of the Vivian Ferrin Memorial Scholarship Foundation. President Ernie Garvey, Dr. Ealy and Ms. Genieve White, 2nd. Vice President did introductions of the presenters, respectively. After each presentation, recipients were allowed 3 minutes to introduce themselves to the audience and talk briefly about their future plans.

The guest speaker for the evening was Dr. Janice Scott Cover, Assistant Superintendent for Quality Assurance for Palm Beach County School District and Founder of The Caribbean Educators Association (CARE). She brought greetings from the Superintendent of Palm Beach County Schools and conveyed words of wisdom to the graduates. Dr. Cover shared a poem, *The Power of One,* with the recipients. The words of the poem were as encouraging and deeply rooted as her words of advice. The recipients were very receptive to all that she shared with them.
