### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The true spirit of volunteerism and giving within CAFCI has grown tremendously over the years through Relay for Life, now in its 13th year. The event has successfully brought our members together in one single night to celebrate cancer survivorship, the resilience and determination of those individuals who continue to inspire and reaffirm the mission of the organization, and in a more personal way, reinforce the need for all to continue to fight back.

Relay for Life: The Relay For Life concept involves a team of workers/runners competing against each other to raise the most money and to stay all night at the event. The event is a relay that lasts for an extended period - an overnight of 12-15 hours - because 'cancer never sleeps'. Worldwide, approximately two thirds of all cancer deaths could have been prevented or the risk significantly reduced by changes in lifestyle, such as proper diet and nutrition, physical activity, non-use of tobacco, and limited alcohol consumption.
