

The Home of Our Own committee met with the CAFCI Board of directors on March 12, 2016 to discuss the status of the program and begin mapping the strategy moving forward as the urgency to find a home for CAFCI increases.

The group agreed that a contingency plan should be put in place in the event we have to vacate the Harvin Center prior to finding another location. Our current focus will be to solicit assistance from organizations that specialize in providing assistance in planning for and finding financing for non-profit organizations seeking to purchase property. We are following up on two leads provided by members and
